

Expand Internship Program to Industry Parnters




Goal: Enrich student learning experiences in advanced composites through industry interaction and exposure to real-world applications and practices.

Hosting and Mentoring an IACMI Intern



- Identify a person to mentor the intern
- Complete the online mentor orientation module
- Access the Zintellect application database and select candidates
- ORAU will extend the offer and inform you when the selection has been finalized
- Attend online orientation prior to start of program

Roles and Responsibilities



- Host site provide orientation to the student to include environmental health and safety training for your facility, expectations, reporting structure, overview of roles and protocol
- Mentor determine an appropriate project for intern, maintain day to day accountability, facilitation of project developments and program requirements
- Intern behave responsibly, fulfill expectations, meet program deliverables and requirements, turn in requested and required paperwork

Roles and Responsibilities, cont.



- IACMI —sponsors program, provides updates and reports to DoE and other stakeholders, manage the relationship with the host partner, provide oversite and direction for the program
- ORAU recruits candidates, issues appointment offer, administers stipends, housing allowances, and facilitates/reimburses in and outbound travel and travel to Members' Meeting
